Re-enrollment for the 2025 academic year

Re-enrolment for the 2025-2026 school year has been taking place directly on Eduka since 24th March.

In order to prepare for the start of the new school year, it is important to have a clear picture of the number of pupils re-enrolled as soon as possible. We therefore invite parents who are certain that their child will be attending LFIB in September 2025 to re-register their child as soon as possible.

If you are unsure, you can contact the headteacher to inform him of the possibility of your child leaving the school.

Finally, if you know that you will be leaving the school at the end of the school year, you can apply to have your child disenrolled via Eduka.

New school project: days off

As a reminder, you were informed at the beginning of March that the LFIB school community would be preparing the 2025-2028 school project.

Representatives of the entire Lycée educational community (parents, students and staff) are being asked to take part.

In order to finalise the action plans and enable all the teachers to work together, **the half-day of 19th May 2025** will be 'off-work', i.e. all the pupils will be released **from 2.15 p.m. onwards**. There will be no reinforced Thai classes for CP and CE1. There will be no AES on this day.

Similarly, there will be no classes on **30th June 2025**. Children don't come to school.

The festivities will come to a close on Friday 11th April with a big water fight. **It is essential that students bring a change of clothes, a towel, flip-flops, sun cream and a cap.** Bowls and cups will be provided, and elementary school pupils can bring their own water pistols.
